The new subject leader is an existing senior member of staff who has a degree in sports science. She is interested to attend CPD in primary school physical education subject leadership, and to attend some sporting events and network opportunities next year to develop herself in this role. • Further CPD for all staff for some of the school games events- Kwik Cricket, Be Netball- due to changes in staffing and to ensure continued high standards and opportunities at inter school events and competitions. • Introduction of new lunchtime sports club opportunities (via the Future Games), to replace those extra-curricular and active school opportunities that have been lost due to staffing changes. • Introduction of Girls Football club following training by a member of staff ---- scheme • Introduction of a new PE scheme of work (Primary PE Planning) with inbuilt CPD video material to continue to raise standards in PE teaching and learning across the school. (Due to changes in staffing). • Year 4 pupils to consistently run lunchtime activity clubs and young leader level 1 events for the younger pupils- this has been sporadic this year due to COVID situation and will need to be carefully planned across Bubbles- with social distancing in mind. • School to support LC2 virtual events and competitions to ensure that pupils continue to have opportunities for competitive sporting activities (virtually) during the Autumn term at least. • All staff to have training in Inclusion sports- to support teaching and learning for pupils with physical disabilities as they move up through the school. • Continued monitoring of progress and assessment in PE due to a new progression of skills document.
